Introduction to Open Educational Resources (OER)

The [College Board estimates that the average student spends about \\$1200 a year](#) on textbooks

College textbook prices have [risen 812% since 1978](#), far outpacing the rate of price increase for medical services (575%), new home prices (325%), and the Consumer Price Index (250%). From [2003 to 2013 college textbook prices rose 82%](#), approximately *triple the rate of inflation* in overall consumer prices (CPI) during the same time (27%)

[65% of students report not purchasing a textbook](#) because of its high price. And many do so, knowing their grade will likely suffer because they cannot afford the book

Research shows that students who used open textbooks tended to have [higher grades](#) and [lower withdrawal rates](#) than their peers who used traditional textbooks

Oklahoma State University-OER Pilot

Completed manuscripts of approximately 200-300 pages, or 50K -75K words, written in English, and should be accessible, engaging, and suitable for use in community college, college or university courses.

The manuscript should include: abstract of approximately 100 words, introduction, and all references cited.

Citations should be submitted using standards appropriate to the discipline e.g. APA, Chicago Manual of Style, MLA, etc.

The author(s) must verify and obtain appropriate permissions for any copyrighted work used in the work.

The author(s) agrees to publish a freely accessible e-book with OSU Library Open Textbooks with a Creative Commons Attribution-NonCommercial-ShareAlike 4.0 Unported License. Terms can be found at: <http://creativecommons.org/licenses/by-nc-sa/4.0/>


Oklahoma State University-ePress

We needed a way to:

Provide support such as copy editing for authors who request it

Provide access to the finished books via Pressbooks (website in progress):
libapp.okstate.edu/epress

Offer printing “on-demand”: Piloting this model with an ECON 2103 class where the cost of just the needed chapters is \$8.77 vs \$35 for the textbook on OpenStax (which is still an option)

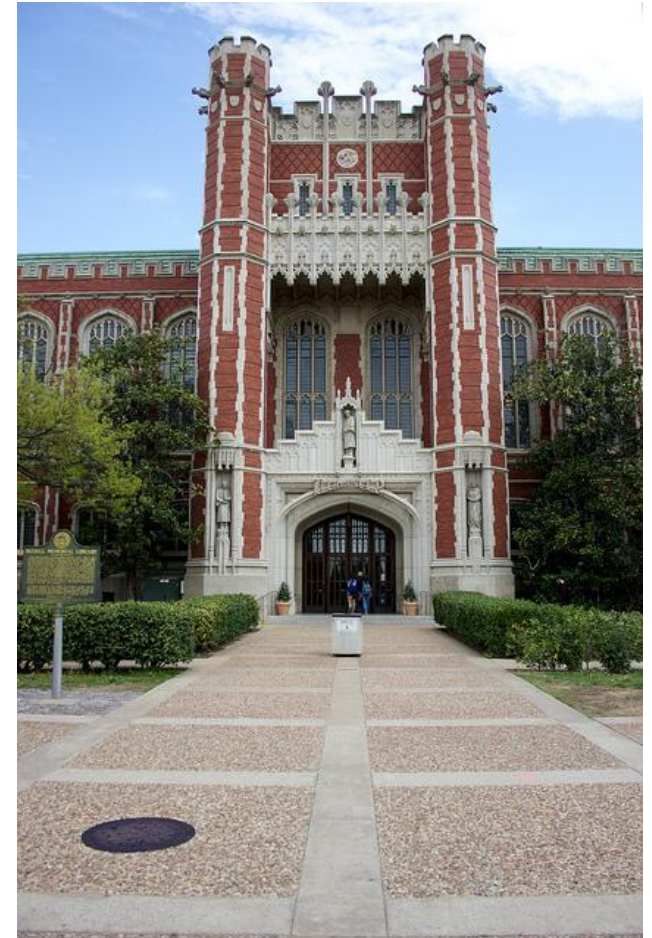

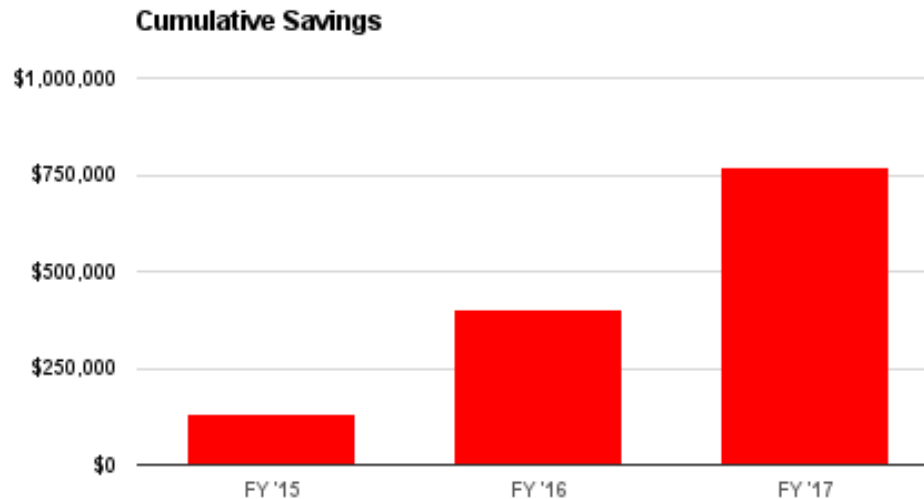
